Academic Overview

The Junior Preparatory Phase

The Junior Preparatory Phase begins in Grade One. This is the year in which our children learn to read and write. Our Grade Two year consolidates these basic foundation skills and encourages ongoing, cross-curricular learning. Grade Three is the last year in our phase and this is where we prepare our children for the more independent style of teaching and learning in the Senior Phase. Our classes in Grade One and Grade Two consist of 22 children, per class, and this number is increased to 24 children, per class, in Grade Three.

The Junior Preparatory Phase follows an integrated curriculum. A hands-on approach is encouraged. The class teachers focus on Mathematics, English, Life Skills, Life Orientation and Multifaith.

The children are also exposed to various specialist subjects. These are isiZulu, Afrikaans, Physical Education, Computer Education, Media, Singing and Art.

The Junior Preparatory Phase day starts at 07:30 and finishes at 13:30.

Our Grade One and Two children have an Integrated Day Sports programme in which they are introduced to all the sports that we offer.

The Grade Two and Grade Three children are also encouraged to join the choir and we offer an Orff band to the Grade Threes. They are encouraged to choose both sporting and cultural activities from our extensive co-curricular programme.

The Senior Preparatory Phase

The Senior Preparatory section of our school is comprised of pupils in Grades Four to Seven. In order to facilitate the transition from the Junior Preparatory, our Grade Fours have most of their lessons with their class teachers who closely monitor their academic progress, social development and general well-being. In the Grade Five year, the pupils are better equipped to change classes in order to attend a variety of subjects. At Beaulieu Preparatory, pupils in Grades Five to Seven are divided into different classes for the benefits of differentiated learning in Mathematics. These classes are smaller than their registered classes so as to optimise learning success. Our pupils enjoy the benefits of a varied and authentic curriculum which affords opportunities to explore their creative, sporting, cultural, technological and academic talents.

Grades Four to Seven pupils participate in an annual tour which lasts between two and four days. The tours focus not only on educational opportunities, but also on the development of physical and emotional awareness and skills.

The Grades Four to Seven pupils benefit from a Study Skills course in addition to the metacognitive tools they routinely use for manipulating ideas and content. Parent courses are also facilitated so that the home and the school work together to ensure that pupils' learning is meaningful and easily and clearly organised.

In the Senior Preparatory Phase there are three classes per grade with a maximum of 25 pupils per class. The co-curricular timetable includes swimming, tennis, cricket, soccer, hockey, netball, softball, athletics, art, drama, choir, chess, cross-country and equestrian, golf, music, quiz, debating and robotics, amongst other activities.





Sport Overview

At Beaulieu Preparatory School, we believe that sport should be enjoyed by all participants and that competitive sport, at too young an age, can result in disenchantment. At an Under 9 level, matches are regarded as educational opportunities in which the competitive aspect is secondary to the participants' assimilation of all aspects of the game.

Our aim is to develop our children's physical skills by introducing them to as many different sporting activities as possible. Our programme allows us to introduce pupils to the merits of teamwork and interaction, and to teach them to win or lose with grace and dignity. The rules and etiquette of a variety of games are taught from a young age. The school provides appropriate sporting equipment to enable the pupils to participate effectively in practices and in matches against other schools. Our pupils learn to take care of the equipment they use and to take pride in their appearance both on and off the field.

We recognise each individual's ability and motivate him/her to persevere and achieve and we also teach all our pupils the importance of being ambassadors of the school. We ensure that every Beaulieu Preparatory pupil who wishes to represent our school has the opportunity to realize this goal. Above all, we teach the importance of fair play and good sportsmanship.



Cultural Overview

The Arts form an integral part of life at Beaulieu Preparatory school and we offer Art, Drama, dance and musical activities both during the school day and as an option after school. These activities play a central role in developing the whole child. Initially, children learn through play. Cultural experiences in the Arts provide a natural platform for this type of learning. Cultural activities stimulate and develop the imagination and creative thinking, and refine cognitive skills whilst having a tremendous impact on the developmental growth of every child. Cultural participation strengthens problem-solving and thinking skills, adding to overall academic achievement and school success.

Acting in a play, singing in a choir or playing in an orchestra nurtures important values, including team-building skills, respecting alternative viewpoints and appreciating and being aware of different cultures and traditions. In addition, active listening skills are fine-tuned and confidence is boosted. Participating in the Arts also plays a central role in enhancing cognitive, fine and gross motor skills, language skills and social-emotional development. Being involved in multi-sensory activities enhances learning, stimulates memory, facilitates understanding, builds symbolic communication, promotes relationships, and provides an avenue for developing competence.

Cultural activities offered at Beaulieu Prep include choir, band, orchestra, singing, orff class, marimba band, musical instrument tuition, ballet, drama, eisteddfod, drumline, art, debating and quiz.





BeNS Nursery School

Small classes. Happy children. Nurturing and creative staff. Beaulieu Nursery School (fondly called BeNS) opened its doors for the first time in January 2013 when the school took thirty six children into both Grade Triple Nought and Grade Double Nought. Currently, the Nursery School has the capacity for 1 x Toddler class and 3 classes in each of Grade Triple Nought, Grade Double Nought and Grade Nought.

Our BeNS family of pupils, parents, staff and community strives to develop and inspire the children to be the best that they can be, while promoting diversity and a respect for those around them.

BeNS has always been a place where children feel safe and secure in the knowledge that they are loved and nurtured. Our children are immersed in a world of creativity, music and self-expression while being cared for in a friendly, supportive environment. Play is the vehicle for learning.

Whether role playing or enjoying story time, being creative with paint and sand or clambering up apparatus in the playgrounds – each day is action packed. Small groups led by qualified teachers make learning enjoyable and there's always time for moments of calm with a rest after lunch.

BeNS provides the stimulus and the children provide the imagination. Children are not afraid to get messy when exploring goop, sawdust, birdseed and other interesting, tactile materials in our sensopathic trays. They also enjoy baking, whether in the children's kitchen or in the mud pit. Music and physical education introduce movement and song. The children's physical development is of great importance at this early age, hence it is carefully and progressively developed at BeNS. Our children are encouraged to be actively involved in their own education and this encourages higher order thinking and life-long learning.
